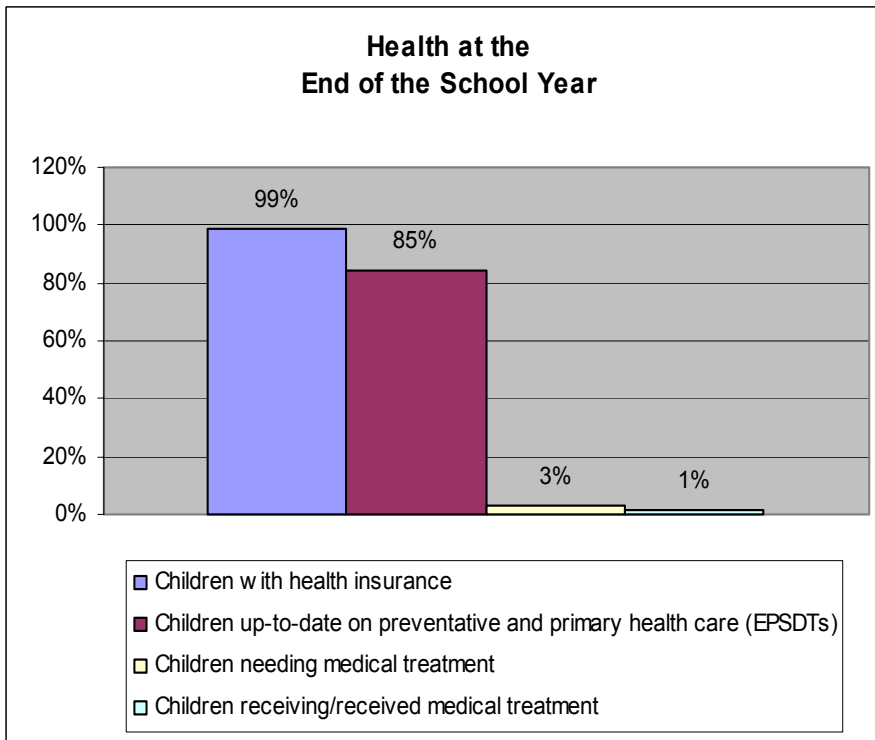


Health Outcomes



Within the first 45 days of school starting, our staff complete the following screenings:

- Behavioral (social/emotional)
- Development (including Heights and Weights)
- Sensory (Hearing and Vision)

Through these exams and check-ups, 32 children (out of 176) received medical treatment for chronic health condition (19 Asthma, 8 Overweight, 7 Vision problems, 1 Anemia, and 1 Hearing difficulties)

Within the first 90 days of school starting, our staff ensure:

- Family Partnership Goals
- Physical and Dental exams



Dental Outcomes

Our data consistently show 30 to 40 percent of children with dental concerns. Because of this data, DLEC has done the following :

- Family Service Specialist (FSS) ensure children receive a dental exam and follow-up treatment if needed and educate parents about the dangers of baby tooth decay and tooth brushing
- Several staff members received training on the Cavity Free Kids Curriculum
- Implemented major changes to our menus for both children and parent meeting nights. Juice is served only once per month, and only water is served at parent meetings and trainings.
- Conducted a parent training night on oral health in partnership with Seattle Children's last school year. Children received free toothbrushes, floss, toothpaste and a free screening.



This year, the number of children with cavities went down significantly to only 5% with new untreated dental concerns.
